

Lit up when data is accessed and read from disc, or the drive is playing audio.

5. EJECT/LOAD BUTTON


Eject and load the tray from drive unit.





CHAPTER 7 BEFORE REQUESTING SERVICE

7.1 PICK UP CLEANING

Usage of CD-ROM drive for a long term causes dust on pick-up objective lens and furthermore depletion of optical performance. In order to remove dust on lens, this CD-ROM drive has lens cleaning mechanism. Load and eject the tray, then start cleaning automatically. The periodical cleaning is desired to maintain drive performance.

7.2 TROUBLE AND CORRECTION

- (1) There are many kinds of troubles caused by misuse. When a problem occurs, check the Table below which describes possible problems occurring with your CD ROM.
- (2) If the CD ROM is not operating correctly and you cannot restore operation by following the detailed procedures in the Table below, do not remove the cover of the units or adjust further.
- (3) On upper occasion, unplug the unit and consult with your dealer or the nearest service station.
