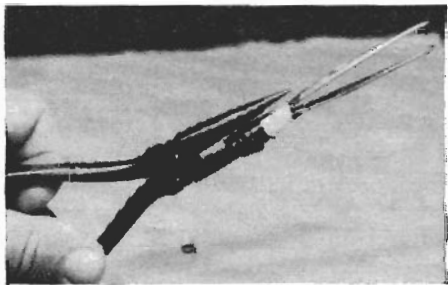


TWEEZER EXTENSION

TWEEZERS are sometimes needed to insert tiny screws, pins, lock keys, etc. in close places or restricted areas. Similarly, such a tool is often needed to remove tiny unwanted items from compact instruments or mechanisms. Unfortunately the working area is often so restricted that the tweezers cannot be manipulated successfully.

To provide a suitable extension for use in such places, simply tape the tweezers to one jaw of a pair of longnose pliers, as shown in the photograph. The tweezers are situated in such a way that when the jaws of the pliers are closed it will also close the tweezers jaws so that the tiny part can be picked up and held or released, as desired. ▲
