



Notes:

- This Unit supports 2-channel (L/R) audio and 5.1ch (Multi-channel) MPEG Audio 1/2 (only when the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT coaxial jack is used for connection). It does not support 7.1 channel MPEG Audio Version 2.0.
- When playing back a CD-G (Graphics) or CD EXTRA disc, the audio portion will be played, but the graphic images will not be shown.

Title, Chapter and Tracks

- DVDs are divided into "titles" and "chapters". If the disc has more than one movie on it, each movie would be a separate "title". "Chapters" are sections of titles.
- Audio CDs are divided into "tracks". A "track" is usually one song on an Audio CD.

 Numbers identify each title, chapter, and track on a disc. Most discs have these numbers recorded on them, but some do not.

REMOTE CONTROL

Using the Remote Control

- · Point the Remote Control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the unit.
- When there is a strong ambient light source, the performance of the infrared REMOTE SENSOR may be degraded, causing unreliable operation.
- The recommended effective distance for remote operation is about 16 feet (5 meters).

Take out the PVC sheet before operating the Remote Control.



TO CHANGE REMOTE BATTERY

1. Open the battery door.



2. Insert one CR2025 (3V) size battery.



BATTERY REPLACEMENT


When battery becomes weak, the operating distance of the Remote Control will greatly reduced and you will need to replace the battery.




POWER SUPPLY

A. Using the AC adapter

This AC adapter operates on AC 100V - 120V.


Cautions:

- The included AC adapter is for use with this unit only. Do not use them with other equipment.
- When the unit is not going to be used for long time, disconnect the AC adapter from the AC outlet.
- When the AC adapter is plugged in, the apparatus is not completely disconnected from the main, even when the power is turned off.



B. Using a car plug adapter

A 12V car plug adapter allows the players to be used with vehicles that have a 12V, negative ground electrical system.



Cautions:

- When purchasing a car plug adapter, seek expert advice to ensure it is fully compatible with the DVD players.
- In the interests of the traffic safety, do not perform operations on the unit or view video software while driving a vehicle.
- Make sure the unit is fastened correctly to prevent from falling in the vehicle in the event of an accident.
- When the inside of the cigarette lighter socket is dirty with ashes or dust, the plug section
 may become hot due to poor contact. Be sure to clean the cigarette lighter socket before
 use.
- After use, disconnect the 12V car plug adapter from both the unit and cigarette lighter socket.

POWER SUPPLY

Turning on the unit


- 1. Slide the POWER ON/OFF switch on the right side of unit to "ON" position.
- 2. The DVD logo (start-up picture) will appear on unit screen.



CONNECTIONS

A. Connecting a TV

- If your TV has Audio/Video inputs, you can also connect the unit to your TV using Audio/Video cable.
- You must turn the VOLUME control in MAX position when you connect to other equipment. In the same time no sound will be output from the unit's speaker and headphone.



Watching a DVD on your TV


- 1. Turn on the unit.
- 2. Turn on the TV and set it to DVD mode.

B. Another source connection

Digital connection

This unit can play Dolby Digital, but only in two channels.



Listening to another audio equipment

- 1. Turn on the Unit.
- Turn on your audio equipment and follow the instructions included with it to select the DIGITAL IN function.

Notes:

- If the external equipment is a television and this audio system is close to it, you
 may experience interference if the tuner function is selected while the television
 is working.
- Due to copyright protection, DVD movies cannot be copied. If you copy a DVD movie onto a videotape, the resulting copy will be unclear, with poor sound quality. This is NOT caused by a defective DVD system.

CONNECTIONS

Using Headphones / Earphones

- Turn down the volume before connection, and then adjust the level.
- When headphones / earphones are connected, no sound will be output from the unit's speaker.

Caution:

 Avoid listening to sound at levels which may be harmful to your ears.

Dolby Digital

The unit automatically recognizes the Dolby Digital bitstream and provides a downmix suitable for two-channel listening. An additional Dolby Digital decoder is required for reproduction of the discrete multi-channel soundtracks available on many DVDs.

SCREEN VIEWING ANGLE ADJUSTMENT

The screen is designed to allow users to have a comfortable viewing angle. The viewing angle can be adjusted as top $-8^{\circ} \sim +8^{\circ}$.

· Push screen frame to adjust viewing angle.

Caution:

 Do not force the screen frame over its maximum viewing angle settings as stated above. Attempting this will result in damaging the unit.



INSTALLING THE STAND

Push out the feet from the bottom of unit and make sure the unit is stablely stand up on the table.

Push the metal stand inward and remove the stand.







Installing the Unit in Car

· Use supplied mounting strap installing the unit onto the seat back in a car.





Note:

Remove the stand, before installing the unit onto the seat back. Please see "INSTALLING THE STAND".

PLAYING A DISC Basic playback



This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this unit. Some DVD discs are produced in a manner that allows specific or limited operation during playback. Such as, the unit may not respond to all operating commands. This is not a defect in the unit. Refer to the instruction notes of discs.

" \overline{\overline{O}}" may appear on the screen during operation. A " \overline{O}" means that the desired operation is not permitted by the unit or disc.

Playing a Disc

1. Slide the POWER ON/OFF switch on the right side of unit into ON mode.

See CUSTOMIZING THE FUNCTION SETTINGS (page 25 to 26) before proceeding to step 2.

- 2. Hold the top and slide the OPEN switch to open the disc door.
- Hold the disc by its sides and carefully fit onto the central support of compartment with the label side facing forward until you hear a "click".
- 4. Close the disc door.
 - It takes a short while for your unit to load the disc. After loading, for some discs, the unit will automatically start playback of the disc.
- 5. Press the ► PLAY button.



Pausing playback (still mode)

Press the II PAUSE button. To resume normal playback, press the ▶ PLAY button. Each time you press the II PAUSE button, the picture advances one frame.

Stopping playback

Press the ■ STOP button at the location where you want to interrupt playback. To resume playback at the position where the disc was stopped, press the ▶ PLAY button. If you press the ■ STOP button twice, the unit's memory will be cleared and pressing the ▶ PLAY button will reset the disc to the beginning.

To skip to a different track

- Press the I◄ PREV button repeatedly to skip to the start of the current or previous track.
- Press the ►► NEXT button to skip to the next track.
- For audio CD disc, use the number buttons (remote control only) to jump straight to that track number.

Fast Forward/Fast Reverse

Press the SEARCH → or SEARCH button when a disc is playing.

The speed of fast scan

The disc begins fast scan at x2 speed.
 Four speeds are available. Each time SEARCH ▶ or ◀
 SEARCH button is pressed, the speed of fast scan changes in the

following sequence: $\rightarrow x 2 \longrightarrow x 4 \longrightarrow x 8 \longrightarrow x 20$

Note:

You also can press and hold I◄◄/►► (PREV/NEXT) buttons on the unit repeatedly to select different fast scan speeds.

Press the ► PLAY button when you reach the desired point to resume playback at normal speed.

SKIP (Forward / Reverse)

While you are playing a disc, press the ►►INEXT button to move to the beginning of the next chapter or track. Press the I◄◄ PREV button to move to the previous chapter or track and automatically start playing it.

PLAYING A DISC Basic playback




Angle selection

Some DVDs contain scenes which have been shot from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from each of these different angles.

- While you are playing a DVD with different angles recorded, press the ANGLE button to view the number of the current angle.
- Press the ANGLE button repeatedly to change the scene to the next angle in those recorded.
 - About two seconds later, playback continues from the new angle you selected.
 - If no button is pressed within 10 seconds, playback continues without changing the current angle.



Sequence of angle shots (Example)



Notes:

- This function can only be used for discs on which scenes shot from multiple angles have been recorded.
- If only one angle is recorded, " 🖺 1/1" is displayed.

Audio selection

On some discs, the sound is recorded in two or more formats. Follow the directions below to select the type of playback.

- While a disc is playing, press the AUDIO button to show the current audio format number.
- Press the AUDIO button repeatedly to select the desired audio format.



Notes

- If only one audio format is recorded, the number does not change.
- About two seconds later, playback continues in the new audio format.

Subtitle selection

- While a DVD is playing, press the SUBTITLE / RETURN button to display the current language setting, as shown in the example below.
- Press the SUBTITLE/RETURN button repeatedly to select the desired subtitle language.



Notes:

- If only one language is recorded, the language does not change.
- About two seconds later, playback continues with the new subtitle you selected.
- The number of languages recorded differs depending on the disc.
- If no button is pressed within a few seconds, playback continues without changing the current subtitle.
- This function can only be used for discs on which subtitles have been recorded in multiple languages.
- On some DVDs, subtitles are activated from the main menu of the DVD. Press the MENU button to activate the main menu.

SPECIAL FUNCTIONS




DISPLAYfunction

Using DISPLAY, you can check and change the current settings of the following items: ANGLE, AUDIO and SUBTITLE.

· While the disc is playing, press the DISPLAY button to display the screen shown below.

Elapsed time: Elapsed time from the beginning of the chapter which is currently playing.

Remaining time: Remaining time of the title which is currently playing.



- Press the DISPLAY button twice to display the screen shown as below.
- · Press the ANGLE, AUDIO and SUBTITLE button to change the selected item.



Title skip

- The number of the title currently playing and total titles of disc.
- Press the GOTO button to set your desired title, then press the ENTER button to confirm.

Chapter skip

- The number of the chapter currently playing and total chapters of the currently played title.
- Press the GOTO button to set your desired chapter, then press the ENTER button to confirm.

Time skip

- Elapsed time from the beginning of the currently playing chapter and the remaining time from the beginning of the currently playing title.
- Press the GOTO button to set your desired point to start playback, then press the ENTER button to confirm.

Angle setting

- The current angle is displayed. When a disc with only one angle is played back,
 " ¹/₂ 1" is displayed.
- Press the ANGLE button to select the desired angle.

Audio settina

- The type of audio currently selected is displayed.
- Press the AUDIO button to select your desired type of audio.

Subtitle setting

- The subtitle number and language currently selected is displayed. When a disc with only one subtitle is played back, ".....1/If Eng" is displayed.
- Press the SUBTITLE button to select your desired language.

Bit rate information

 Amount of picture, sound and subtitle data in the DVD video disc transferred per second. The larger the value is, the more data processed, but this does not necessarily insure better picture quality.

GOTO function

This function allows you to skip directly to any part of the disc while a disc is playing.



Note:

 After settings, press the DISPLAY button again to return to the normal screen.

SPECIAL FUNCTIONS



Locating a specific title OVD

If a DVD disc contains title numbers, you can locate a specific title by directly selecting a title number.

- 1. In stop mode, press the GOTO button.
- Press ▼, ◀ or ▶ button to highlight a specific field and press the corresponding number button(s) for the title you want.
- Press the ENTER button to confirm. The Unit will start playback about 3 seconds later.



Locating a specific chapter / track

If you know the chapter / track number you want to play, you can locate a specific chapter / track by directly selecting a chapter / track number.

- 1. Press the GOTO button to search your desired chapter / track.
- Press ▼, ◀ or ▶ button to highlight a chapter / track and press the corresponding number button(s) for the chapter you want.
- Press the ENTER button to confirm. The Unit will start playback about 3 seconds later.



SPECIAL FUNCTIONS



Locating a specific time

You can move to a specific location by entering its corresponding time (hours, minutes, seconds)

- 1. Press the GOTO button.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ button to highlight time.





- 3. Press the corresponding number buttons for the setting point you want.
 - The first two numbers you entered represent hours.
 - The second two numbers you entered represent minutes.
 - · The third two numbers you entered represent seconds.
- 4. Press the ENTER button to confirm. The Unit will start playback about 3 seconds later. Notes:
- · Some discs may not respond to this process.
- Some scenes may not be located as precisely as you specified.
- This method for accessing specific locations is available only within the current title of the DVD disc.
- You can move through the menu by pressing the ▲ and ▼ buttons.

Angle setting OVD

- Press the DISPLAY button twice. The FUNCTION menu is displayed on the screen and you can see how many angles are recorded on the disc.
- Press the ANGLE button repeatedly to select your desired angle.
- 3. The Unit change to your desired angle at once.





Audio setting OVD



PLAYING MP3 AND PICTURE FILE DISC

This unit can play MP3 and Picture files recorded on CD-R and CD-RW discs.

Playing a MP3 file disc

- 1. Slide the **OPEN** switch to open the disc door.
- Hold a MP3 file disc by its sides and carefully fit onto the central support of compartment with the label side facing up you until you hear a "click".
- 3. Push the door to close.
- 4. The unit will take a short while to load the disc, automatically begin playback and screen display of MP3 files.
- Press the ▲, ▼, ◀ or ▶ CURSOR button to view and select the files, you want to listen to then press ENTER button to confirm and this selected file will be playbacked.



To pause playback

Press the II PAUSE button. To resume playback again, press the ► PLAY button.

To stop playback

Press the STOP button.

To skip to the next or previous file

- Press the >> NEXT button on the remote control or on the top of unit briefly while
 playing, to skip ahead to the beginning of the next file. Each time you press the button
 consecutively, the beginning of the next file is located and played back.
- Press the —— PREV (Previous) button on the remote control or on the top of unit briefly
 while playing, to skip back to the beginning of the previous file. Each time you press the
 button consecutively, the beginning of the previous files is located and played back.
- You also can press the GOTO button, set the track number you want and then press the ENTER button.
- 1. You can not play in Fast reverse or Fast forward during MP3 playback.
- 2. During MP3 playback, if you press the STOP button Twice and then press ► PLAY button again, it will start to play from the beginning of the file which you stopped. If you press the STOP button once and then press ► PLAY button again. It will resume playback from the location where you stopped playback.

Notes

The ability of this unit to read MP3 discs is dependent on the following:

- The Bit Rate must be within 64 256 kbps.
- The total number of files on the disc should not exceed 254.
- The maximum number of directories should not exceed 32.
- The maximum depth level of directories should not exceed 4.
- File names should be named using 7 or fewer letters and/or numbers, and must incorporate the "MP3" file extension. EXAMPLE: *******.MP3 where each * is a letter or number.
- Use only letters and / or numbers in file names. If you use special characters, the file and/or folder names may not be displayed correctly on the on-screen display.
- When recording on CD-R discs, use 74-minute (650MB) discs.
- The CD-R or CD-RW discs should be "finalized" in computer by "single session format".
- See your CD/MP3 creation software for details.

PLAYING MP3 AND PICTURE FILE DISC

Playing a Picture file disc

- 1. Slide the OPEN swtich to open the disc door.
- Hold the Picture file disc by its sides and carefully fit onto the central support of compartment with the label side facing up you until you hear a "click".
- 3. Push the door to close.
- 4. The unit will take a short while to load the disc, automatically begin playback. The next picture will automatically display after 6 seconds.



Notes:

- You can press the PAUSE button to interrupt playback, and press the PLAY button to resume playback.
- You also can use GOTO function or use the numbered buttons to enter the number to quickly select any image.
- Press the ANGLÉ button on the remote control to rotate the picture orientation by 90°.

Playing a MP3/Picture file disc

- 1. Slide the **OPEN** switch to open the disc door.
- Hold a MP3 files/Picture file disc by its sides and carefully fit onto the central support of compartment with the label side facing up you until you hear a "click".
- 3 Push the door to close
- 4. The unit will take a short while to load the disc, automatically begin playback. The MP3 files or Picture files will be playback one by one.



CUSTOMIZING THE FUNCTION SETTINGS

LANGUAGE setting

- 1. Press the SETUP button in stop mode.
- 2. Use ▲ or ▼ button to one language, then press the ENTER button. The screen will change to your selected language wordings immediately.
- To exit the SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the RETURN button.



VIDEO setting

- 1. Press the **SETUP** button in stop mode.
- Use ◀ or ▶ button to select Video, then press the ENTER button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (TV Shape, Brightness or Edges) to be adjusted by press ▲ or ▼ button, then press the ENTER button. (The screen will change to your desired setting).
- 4. Repeats step 2 and 3 above to adjust other options.
- To exit the FUNCTION SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the RETURN button.

Pan Scan

- When wide-screen video is played, this mode clips the right and left sides of the image so that it can be viewed on a conventional screen.
- Some wide-screen DVDs that do not permit Pan Scan mode playback are automatically played in letterbox mode (black bands top and bottom).

Letter Box

 When wide-screen video is played in this mode on a conventional screen, black bands appear at the top and bottom of the screen.

- When you play DVD discs recorded in the 4:3 aspect ratio, the playback picture will always appears in the 4:3 aspect ratio regardless of the TV shape setting.

AUDIO setting

- 1. Press the SETUP button in stop mode.
- 2. Use ◀ or ▶ button to select Audio, press the ENTER button repeatedly to select "Digital Out or Virutal Effect" type.

Raw: Use this setting when the unit is connected to an external Dolby Digital decoder.

PCM: Use this setting when the unit is connected to an external surround decoder or stereo



RATING

DVD discs equipped with a password function and are rated according to their content. The contents allowed by parental lock level and the way a DVD disc is controlled may vary from disc to disc. For example, if the disc allowed, you could lock-out violent scenes unsuitable for children or you could lock out playback of the disc altogether.

- 1. Press the **SETUP** button in stop mode.
- 2. Use ◀ or ▶ button to select Rating, press the ENTER
- 3. Use ▲ or ▼ button to select parental lock and then press the ENTER button repeatedly to set the parental lock level
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to shift and select Password. enter your 4-digit security code and then press the ENTER button

You cannot play DVD discs rated higher than the level you selected unless you cancel the parental lock function.

The parental lock levels are equivalent to the following ratings.

If you forget the password, you can erase your current password by pressing number button 8 on the remote four times, then press the ENTER button to confirm the setting (PASSWORD: 8888).

MAINTENANCE

Cleaning Disc

A defective or soiled disc inserted into the unit can cause sound to drop out during playback.

Handle the disc by holding its inner and outer edges.


- Do NOT touch the surface of the unlabeled side of the disc.
- · Do NOT stick paper or tape on the surface.
- Do NOT expose the disc to direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Clean the disc before playback. Wipe the disc from the center outward with a cleaning cloth.
- NEVER use solvents such as benzine or alcohol to clean the disc.
- Do NOT use irregular shape discs (example : heart shaped, octagonal, etc.). They
 may cause malfunctions.

Cleaning the unit

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before maintaining the unit.
- · Wipe the unit with a dry soft cloth.
 - If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth which has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly, then wipe with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. Do NOT use compressed air to remove dust.

Important Note

Before transporting the unit, remove disc from the disc compartment.
