USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

TO CHANGE THE REMOTE CONTROL BATTERY

1. Open the battery door.



 Insert one CR2025 (3V) size battery.



BATTERY REPLACEMENT

When the battery becomes weak, the operating distance of the remote control will be greatly reduced and you will need to replace the battery.

Note: If the remote control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the battery.

1) AV2 button

Directly selects AV2 input. 2) FUNCTION button Toggle between TV/AV1/ AV2.

3) AV1 button Directly selects AV1 input.

DISPLAY button Press to show which input you are watching (TV/AV1/ AV2).

Cursor (V, ▲, ◀, ►) buttons Press to highlight selections on a menu screen and make adjust certain settings.

6) SLEEP button

Sets the SLEEP timer. The unit will remain ON for the time that is set, and will automatically shut off after.

CONNECTIONS

CONNECT THE POWER CORD

- Be sure the AC power cord is disconnected and all functions are off before making connections.
- Make sure that all the components are connected correctly.
- To prevent electrical shock, match wide blade of plug to wide slot, fully insert.
- When you are not going to use the Unit for a long period of time, disconnect the power cord.

CONNECTING A TV ANTENNA

To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received from one of the folloiwing sources:

- An indoor or outdoor aerial antenna
- A cable television network
- A satellite network

Note:

For receiving over-the-air TV broadcasts, we recommend that you use an external fixed antenna. Should you require the use of a temporary antenna, please ensure that you purchase an antenna, with sufficient ability to receive in weak signal areas. Only when you are in close proximity to a transmitter will a temporary antenna reproduce a signal as strongly as a fixed antenna.





CONNECTIONS

A. CONNECTING TO AUDIO/VIDEO DEVICES

Connecting to Devices with an S-Video Output

To connect to A/V devices such as a VCR, DVD player, or camcorder:

Connect the right (red) and left (white) audio output from the SOURCE to the right (red) and left (white) input on this unit (Audio cable not included).

Connect the S-VIDEO output from the SOURCE to the S-VIDEO input on this unit (S-VIDEO cable not included).



Make sure you connect both audio and video from the same SOURCE to the same input (AV1/AV2).

Note:

Please refer to the user manual for the SOURCE unit for more information.

Connecting to Devices with a Composite (yellow RCA-type) Video Output

To connect to A/V devices such as a VCR, DVD player, or camcorder:

Connect the right (red) and left (white) audio output from the SOURCE to the right (red) and left (white) input on this unit (Audio cable not included).

Connect the video (yellow) output from the SOURCE to the video input on this unit (Video cable not included).

Make sure you connect both audio and video from the same SOURCE to the same input (AV1/AV2).

CONNECTIONS

B.CONNECTING TO SOURCES WITH COMPONENT VIDEO OUTPUT (DVD - ONLY 480I, 480P, 720P & 1080I ARE SUPPORTED)

Devices with component video output must be connected to the AV2 input: Connect the three video outputs (Y, Pb, Pr) from the SOURCE to the corresponding video inputs on this unit (Component video cable not included).

Connect the right (red) and left (white) audio output from the SOURCE to the right (red) and left (white) input on this unit (Audio cable not included).

Make sure you connect both audio and video from the same SOURCE to AV2.

INSTALLATION

MOUNTING ON THE WALL

This unit is designed to work with standard wall-mounting kits (sold separately). To mount, you must purchase a wall-mounting kit and install the unit according to the directions included with the kit.



USING HEADPHONE

- Turn down the volume before connecting headphones to the unit, then adjust the volume to your desired level.
- When headphones are connected, no sound will come from the front speakers.

Note:

Avoid listening to sound at high levels for prolonged periods of time. This
may be harmful to you and may cause hearing loss.





MAIN MENU

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Picture / Sound / Setup / TV Setting / Restore Setting).
- 3. The screen will change to your selected mode immediately.
- To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on remote control.

NOTE:

• The option of TV setting will not be showed at AV1 & AV2 mode.

PICTURE MENU

- 1. Press the **MENU** button.
- 2. Use \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright button to select the **Picture** menu.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Brightness, Contrast, Color, Sharpness, Hue, Color Temp, Mode) and adjust them using the ◄ or ▶ buttons. (The screen will change to your desired setting).
- 4. Repeats step 3 to adjust other options.
- 5. To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on remote control.



- Brightness : Adjust to brighten the darkest parts of the picture.
- **Contrast** : Adjust to sharpen the picture quality. The black portions of the picture become richer in darkness and the white become brighter.
- Color : Adjust the color of the picture.
- Sharpness : Adjust the sharpness level to improve detail in the picture.
- Hue : Adjust the hue of the picture. (Toward purple / Toward green)
- **Color Temp** : Adjust the three color temperature of the picture. Select Normal (balanced) / Cool (blue white) / Warm (red white) mode.
- Mode : Select from preset screen display settings to match the type of show you are watching (Standard, Personal, Movie, Dynamic, & Soft).



SOUND MENU

- 1. Press the **MENU** button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the Sound menu, then press ◀ and use the button to confirm the setting.
- 3. Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Bass, Treble, Balance, Mode) to be adjusted ◀ and use the ▶ button to adjust each individual setting.
- 4. Repeats step 3 to adjust other settings.
- 5. To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on remote control.



Note:

Experiment with different sound settings until you find the settings you prefer.

- **Bass** : Adjust the bass range.
- Treble : Adjust the treble range.
- Balance : Adjust the balance level toward the left or right speakers.
- Mode : Select from preset sound settings (Personal, Voice, Music, Theater) to match the type of show you are watching.

SETUP MENU

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- **2.** Use \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown button to select the **Setup menu**, then press \blacktriangleleft or \triangleright button to confirm the setting.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (OSD Size, Language, Parental, Timers) to be adjusted, then use the ◄ or ▶ buttons to adjust the individual settings.
- 4. Repeats step 3 to adjust other settings.
- To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on remote control.



Notes:

- OSD Size : Select the screen size you prefer.
- Language : Select from English / Français / Español.

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the Setup menu, then press ◀ or ▶ button to confirm the setting.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the Parental menu, then press ◀ or ▶ button to confirm the setting and the menu locked screen will be displayed.
- Enter a 4-digit lock code, then press ◀ or ➤ button to confirm the setting. Once entered, the screen will enter the Parental menu. The factory preset lock code is " 0000 ".
- To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on remote control.



If you forget the password, enter "8888" to unlock parental control.

TIMERS SETTING

- 1. Press the **MENU** button.
- 2. Use \blacktriangle or \triangledown button to select the **Setup menu**, then press \blacktriangleleft or \triangleright button.
- 3. Use ▲ or ▼ button to select **Timers menu**, then press ◀ or ▶ button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the Sleep timer or Reminder timer setting and press ◄ or ▶ button.
- 5. Repeats step 4 to adjust other options.
- 6. To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on remote control.



Remarks:

- 1. Sleep timer / Reminder timer : Off -> 5 - -> 115 -> 120.
- 2. Sleep timer : Set the LCD TV to turn itself off within a certain time.
- 3. Reminder timer : Set the LCD TV to show the turn off time left.



TV SETTING

- 1. Press the **MENU** button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the TV setting menu, then press ◀ or ▶ button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the Channel no. setting and use the ◀ or ► button to change from AIR (over-the-air broadcasts) to CABLE (cable/ satellite broadcasts).
- 4. Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Tuning mode** and use the ◀ or ▶ button.
- 5. Use ▲ or ▼ button to select the Auto tune and press ◄ or ▶ button to confirm the selection. The unit will immediately search through all possible TV channels and store those channels with signals in memory. After this is complete, the unit will switch to the first channel found.
- 6. To exit the MAIN MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button.



Remarks:

- 1. Channel no. : 2-69 channel for Air mode, 1-125 channel for Cable mode.
- 2. Tuning mode : Air or Cable mode are available.
- 3. Auto tune : Searches for usable stations and stores them in memory.
- 4. Skip : ON Skip weak channels. OFF No channel skip.
- 5. Fine tune : The frequency changes to allow fine tuning.
- 6. AFC : Auto frequency control.

RESTORE SETTING

If you reset the TV to the factory settings, all your present setting on picture, audio, close caption and other feature settings will be erased and replaced by the factory's default settings. However, your lock code will not be erased.



TROUBLE SHOOTING GUIDE

SYMPTOM	CAUSE (AND REMEDY)
No power.	Check that the AC cord is connected.Turn on the unit.
The remote does not function.	 Remove any obstacles between the remote and the unit. Use the remote near the unit. Point the remote at the remote sensor on the unit. Replace the battery in the remote with a new one.
Bad Picture (snow, multiple images, distortion, blurry)	 Check the location of the antenna and adjust it if neccessary. Make sure the antenna cable is connected firmly. Make sure all input cables are firmly.
No sound.	 Increase the volume. Check whether the mute function has been activated on the Remote Control.
Black and white picture.	 Check the Picture setting within the Setup menu. Check to make sure the program you are watching is broadcast in Color and not Black & White.
No picture or sound.	 Make sure the unit is plugged in and turned on. Make sure that the TV mode is selected. Try a new channel to check for possible station trouble. Make sure the antenna is connected properly. Increase the volume. Make sure the antenna or audio/video source device is working properly. Make sure all cables are connected firmly. Check for local interference.
Colored patches of picture.	 Make sure there are no unshielded electrical devices nearby that are causing interference. Turn the TV off for 30 minutes, then try it again.

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
